Opening words

Dear readers,

The main focus of the Prev-Centrum, NGO is the primary and secondary prevention of drug addiction and other social-pathological phenomena and the provision of psychosocial help to people vulnerable to such risks. The Prev-Centrum's main objective is to provide and develop a complex system of services focused on prevention in the community. This system consists of three separate programmes:

Community Activities Centre



Primary Prevention Centre

Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families

The programmes have gradually got off the ground in response to public demand and funding. The oldest of the three, the Primary Prevention Centre, was started up almost 8 years ago. Today, it enjoys stable professional support, including trained, qualified staff and offices.

Its younger sibling, the five-year old Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families, has now acquired the status of a stable out-patient service, and a counselling and therapeutic programme. Few people are unaware of the differences between primary and secondary prevention in connection with the services of the Prev-Centrum, NGO.

In human life, infancy is a period full of surprises and difficulties, such as various childhood diseases. Yet everyone has to go through it to grow up and develop into a healthy individual. The five-year old Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families has managed to establish an experienced professional staff and like its older "sibling", it now has its own suitably equipped offices in which to carry out its work. In 2005, the Counselling Centre is to acquire the "initiation" process of certification. So, we will be hoping to hear it has successfully advanced to the "primary school" stage.

The most recent of the Prev-Centrum family, the Community Activities Centre, will soon be three. It should start kindergarten in autumn. Before that, it will have to stay home with mummy. However, this astonishing "baby" has been growing up so quickly that when referring to its age we should be using some kind of a conversion rate, as with dogs. The Community Activities Centre has also acquired its own attractive offices with a welcoming yet professional ambience that enables them to provide the high-quality services of a low-threshold youth club. Moreover, the youngest one has got its own style of "housekeeping" – this Centre is able to do its own fund raising in the field of social policy. And it is not at all easy – you can imagine people saying: "Just a little tot, naïve, enthusiastic – doesn't need much, will be satisfied with nothing". That is however a misconception. This programme is today as high-profile and mature as the two older siblings and it belongs to the same family.

This family of the three Prev-Centrum programmes provides the network of preventive activities in the local community, offering an integrated system of services, activities and client communication. Some clients come to find a life belt, others seek information, orientation or education.

Every family has the ability to look after itself, to grow and develop. There are times, however, when troubles, problems or crises arise and sometimes it is necessary to seek help outside the family circle. Within the Prev-Centrum association, there were no major problems requiring resolution. We were fortunate in receiving substantial material help, such as the reconstruction of the rooms in the basement of our building and for this help we want to thank to the Prague-6 Municipal Office, the Municipality of Prague and other responsible authorities.

In the year 2004, the programmes of the Prev-Centrum, NGO, were extremely successful. There was a dynamic development of all the available services, educational and other activities – sometimes the expansion might have seemed a little too rapid. My personal wish for the year 2005 is to slow down the growth of the association and its programmes so that they have the opportunity to take root more deeply in the community and make closer contact with other community activities.

I have to mention one more item on my wish-list, one connected with funding of non-governmental, non-profit organisations in the field of drug prevention and psycho-social services. I wish that our association, as well

as other NGOs should not be underfinanced. I wish we did not have to wait six months or more before receiving money after the grant had been awarded. If we were running a shop we would have to simply shut it down. We could do that with our Social Services, of course. There is an important question, however: will families with problems, drug users, children, teachers, desperate parents etc. find the same high-quality range of services, consultations or therapy in the offices of Ministries, Local Government and the like? If the answer is yes – then we do not have to bother. And we can happily start up a florist's shop...

I have one more wish – concerning respect in human relations. I often feel as if I'm living in two different worlds. The first is the world of drug prevention and therapy where I meet people who have problems or troubles in their lives. This world is based on mutual respect and the client - therapist relationship is more or less on an equal footing of mutual respect and confidence. The second world brings the contrasting experience of a non-equal relationship, i.e. the relationship of a Government official to an employee of a NGO, a relationship based on the difference between power and impotence. This is the real world, you will say, both types of human relations are everyday and legitimate. You are right. But I wish we could live also in this 'real' world of power – impotence with more mutual respect. Our work and lives would benefit hugely. Like the action film heroes used to say: "Only doing our job"... and we want to do it well. But we live in the Czech Republic.

I wish a happy year to all of you.

The Prev-Centrum's History

The year 1997: The Prev-Centrum association was founded. One of the association's first aims was implementation of the long-term programme of specific primary prevention of drug addiction and other social pathological phenomena at primary schools.

The year 2000: The increase of demand for long-term primary prevention programmes from primary school teachers. Increasing demand for follow-up information and counselling services. Within the Prev-Centrum, NGO, two separate programmes were formed – *Primary Prevention Centre* and *Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families*.

The year 2000: The Prev-Centrum's project of prevention in community, community activities and other psycho-social services won the competition for renting the offices in the building at Meziškolská street, Prague 6.

13th of December 2001: Official opening day of the Prev-Centrum's programmes in new offices at 2, Meziškolská Street, Prague 6.

The Year 2002: Community Activities Centre was founded, the low-threshold club for kids and youngsters started to work.

The Year 2002: The Certificate of educational institution no. 17 968/2001-25-47 accredited by the Ministry of Education was received.

The Year 2003: The beginning of a long term research (2002 – 2007) in co-operation with the Czech Academy of Science. The research focuses on the community programme in the field of primary prevention on the territory of Prague-6 metropolitan district.

The Year 2003: The expert board of the Czech Society of Family Therapy (SOFT) acknowledged the planned Course of Family Counselling for professionals specialising in drug addiction prevention and treatment. The course is up to the SOFT standards for short programmes.

The Year 2003: Accreditation for social and legal protection of children.

The Year 2004: Certification of professional competence in the field of primary prevention of drug addiction and other social pathological phenomena – assessed by the Council for Coordination of Drug Control Policy of the Government Office of the Czech Republic (RV KPP) and the Ministry of Education (MŠMT). The certificate received on November 11th, 2004.

The Year 2004: The Prague-6 Municipal Office arranged the reconstruction of the offices in the basement of the building at 1120/2, Meziškolská street. In the reconstructed part of the house, the Primary Prevention Centre and the Community Activities Centre including the low-threshold club for kids found their place.

The Year 2004: The twelve-month Course of Family Counselling for professionals specialising in drug addiction prevention and treatment started. The course is in compliance with the SOFT criteria for short programmes. The professional guarantor: MUDr. V. Chvála.

The Year 2004: The Course of Primary Prevention for professionals implementing primary prevention programmes (100 lessons).

The Year 2004: Accreditation of professional competence of an educational institution no. 19 112/2004-25-111, Ministry of Education; the Course in Primary Prevention of Social-pathological Phenomena; the Course in Primary Prevention of Social-pathological Phenomena for School Methodologists.

The Year 2004: Work on the qualitative part of the five-year longitudinal research "Evaluation of Primary Prevention Community Programme"; semi-structured interviews with school prevention methodologists; the website www.evaluaceppp.cz started to work.

The Year 2004: Co-operation with the Psychological Institute of the Czech Academy of Science on the conference "Evaluation of Quality and Effect of Primary Prevention of Drug Addiction" (1st year)

The Year 2004: Translation and publishing of the Czech version of "Drug Prevention Handbook: Drug, Alcohol and Tobacco".

The Year 2004: Co-operation with the community programme "Healthy Prague-6" - organising a two-day seminar for psycho-social service providers "Forum of Psycho-Social Service Providers".

The Year 2004: Co-operation with the community programme "Healthy Prague-6" – participating in the project "Full Jug"

The Year 2004: Co-operation with the community programme "Healthy Prague-6" – participating in the project "Goblin" for school kids; organising the programme "Crystal"

Prev-Centrum Today

The Prev-Centrum association provides services in the field of specific primary prevention of drug abuse and social-pathological phenomena, out-patient counselling and therapeutic services in the field of drug abuse and services connected with community work and community prevention. In 2004, the staff of eleven people participated in the Prev-Centrum's programmes as well as 70 external collaborators (programmes of primary prevention, supervision etc).

In 2004, we managed to provide high-quality professional services within all the association's projects.

In the field of general primary prevention we succeeded in improving the quality of work especially by beginning the programme of intensive professional supervision, by improvement of methodology and initiating the new system of sitting in on seminars of primary prevention. Moreover, we have managed to start up and develop follow-up services in the context of the programmes of selective and indicated primary prevention carried out by the Primary Prevention Centre.

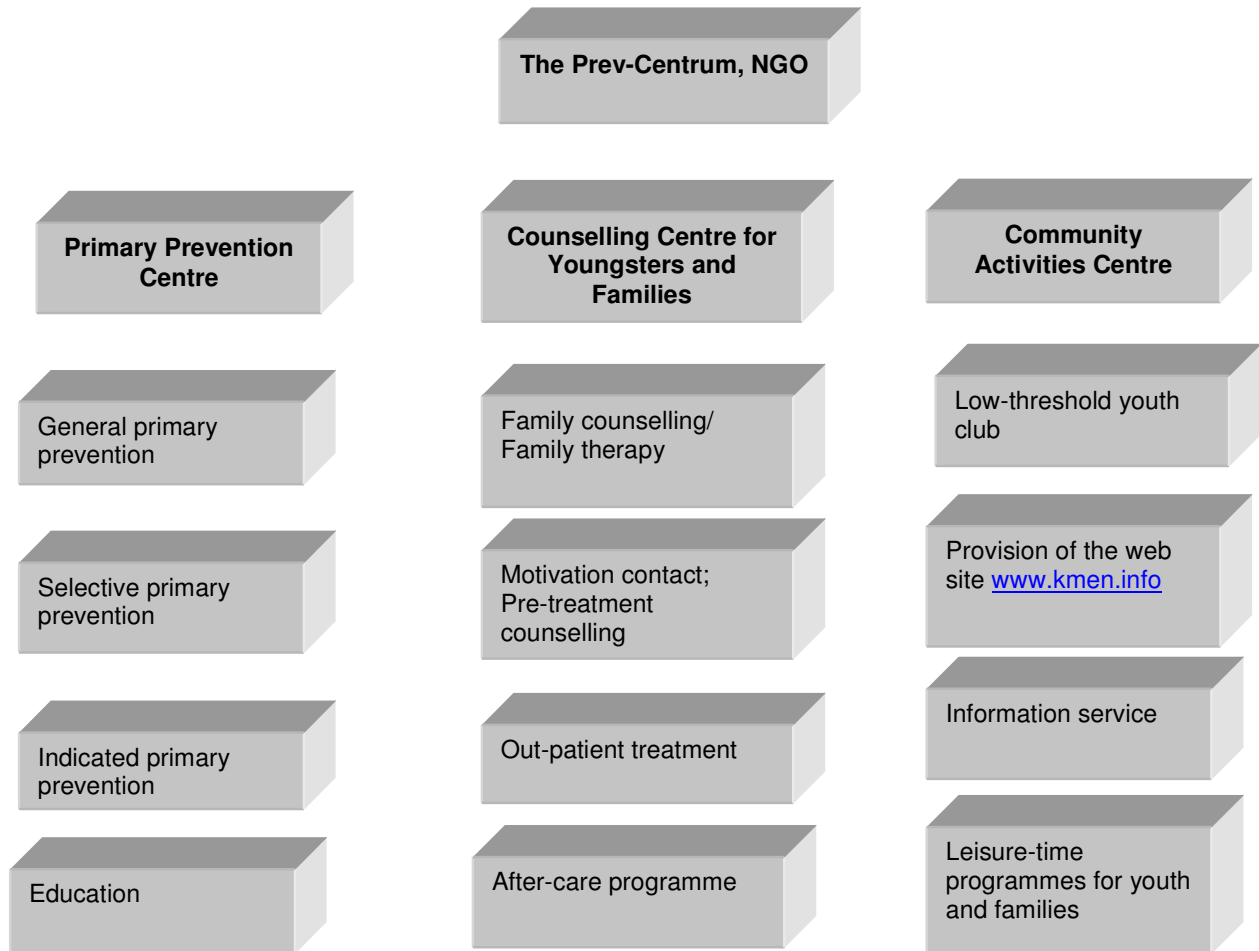
The offer of out-patient services has gradually extended – especially in the field of individual counselling, Buprenorfine substitution programme, family counselling and family therapy. An important step forward is the recent project of the psycho-social service to the clients under the treatment of Buprenorfine substitution. It has shown up that the success of the substitution programme depends on the close co-operation of physicians with psycho-social service providers, motivation group therapy and individual counselling.

As part of the community preventive programme and community work, we have managed to survey the offer of services in the metropolitan district of Prague 6 and have begun networking the services. With the help of our supervisor, the basic services of the centre have been improved – i.e. the activities of the low-threshold youth club extended, as well as the offer of periodic activities for kids, youngsters and families, information service etc.

The Prev-Centrum's ambition to extend and improve its services gained the support of the representatives of Prague-6 local government. In September 2004, the **reconstruction of the rooms in the basement** of the house started, **financed by the Prague-6 Municipal Council and the Municipality of Prague. The reconstruction was finished on January 14th, 2005.** The Primary Prevention Centre started to work in two rooms in the basement – one of them used as an office, another one as a consultation room. There is a small room used as a stock and a large community room with **a direct access to the garden**, too. The community room is used for the selective and indicated primary prevention workshops. Another positive aspect is separation of the Primary Prevention Centre and the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families target groups – i.e. risk children v.s. drug users. The rest of the basement rooms is used by the Community Activities Centre and their low-threshold youth club.

Thanks to the reconstructed basement, the Prev-Centrum's programmes have their own offices to work in, which enables the services to develop better, increases effectiveness of the services and last but not least, offers better access to the services from the public (e.g. the low-threshold youth club).

The System of the Prev-Centrum's Services



The Prev-Centrum Technology Background

During the year 2004, the association managed to modernize technology in the offices of all three programmes. An important step forward was obtaining a computer server including PC network. All data are saved on the server and regularly backed-up on an external hard-disc. Each of the Prev-Centrum's programmes has its own telephone line, a permanent internet connection and a GSM telephone. In 2004, the Community Activities Centre websites www.kmen.info were reconstructed and as a part of the research project Evaluation of Community Primary Prevention Programme, the websites www.evaluaceppp.cz started to work. As a part of building reconstructions, steel supports of the house were renovated.

The Prev-Centrum Professional Background

The Primary Prevention Centre issued the Operation Handbook. The Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families conception was revised in respect to the standards of professional competence. The services of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families and the Primary Prevention Centre were supervised by accredited supervisors. Some of our colleagues helped to prepare the standards of professional competence

for primary prevention programmes in co-operation with the Ministry of Education and the Council for Coordination of Drug Control Policy of the Government Office of the Czech Republic.

Co-operation with Governmental and Non-Governmental Sector

The key role in the association's professional development has the co-operation with the A.N.O. – association of non-governmental organisations focused on drug prevention and treatment, especially in the harm reduction section, primary prevention section and intensive out-patient and after-care section. Naturally, we co-operate with a number of other colleagues from other professional organisations providing services for the clients.

Membership in Professional Organisations

The Prev-Centrum, NGO is a member of the A.N.O. – association of non-governmental organisations focused on drug prevention and treatment. The Primary Prevention Centre is a constituent member of the Primary Prevention Section of the A.N.O.. The employees of the Prev-Centrum association are also members of professional organisations (The Society for Addictive Diseases of J.E. Purkyně's Czech Medical Society, the Harm Reduction Section of the A.N.O., SOFT – Society of Family Therapy).

Other important activities of the Prev-Centrum, NGO include the series of seminars "About Family Therapy", web counselling and websites www.prevcentrum.cz, www.kmen.info and www.evaluceppp.cz as well as co-operation with the Harm Reduction Section of the A.N.O and co-operation with the community programme of the Prague-6 Metropolitan District "Healthy Prague 6".

Economics and Administration

The executive director, in co-operation with an accountant, is in charge of the administration of the association. Accounting and economy of the association is subject to standard legal mechanisms – i.e. the accounting laws, contracts with subsidizers and other inner guidelines of the organisation. The association's economy and accounting is under control according to the law no. 254/2000 Sb. - about an audit by an independent auditor.

Education

The association services include courses and workshops for teachers from all the primary and secondary schools that are part of the primary prevention programme. In 2004, we provided the follow-up course of primary prevention of drug addiction for school methodologists, in co-operation with the Prague-6 Municipal Office and the "Healthy Prague 6" project.

Education for Professionals

The Prev-Centrum, NGO organises the series of Open Interdisciplinary Seminars focused on the problems of prevention and treatment of drug addiction, community prevention, community work, counselling and psychotherapy.

Since the focus of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families is family counselling/therapy the programme's employees initiated continuation of the supervision seminars **About Family Therapy**. On the basis of the co-operation with colleagues from other institutions with similar professional focus, these

seminars have been gradually transformed. Now, they consist of two parts: a case-study seminar and a Balint group.

Another important achievement was starting up the **Course of Family Counselling for professionals specialising in drug addiction prevention and treatment** (*the SOFT short-programme accreditation*).

Education of Primary Prevention Lecturers

In 2004, we organised a new run of training for primary prevention lecturers. The course includes 180 lessons of both theory, practice and self-experience.

Education of the Association Staff

Each member of the staff has got his/her individual education scheme, including study stays at other institutions of the psycho-social network. The separate teams are regularly supervised by external supervisors. Moreover, there is a regular internal supervision.

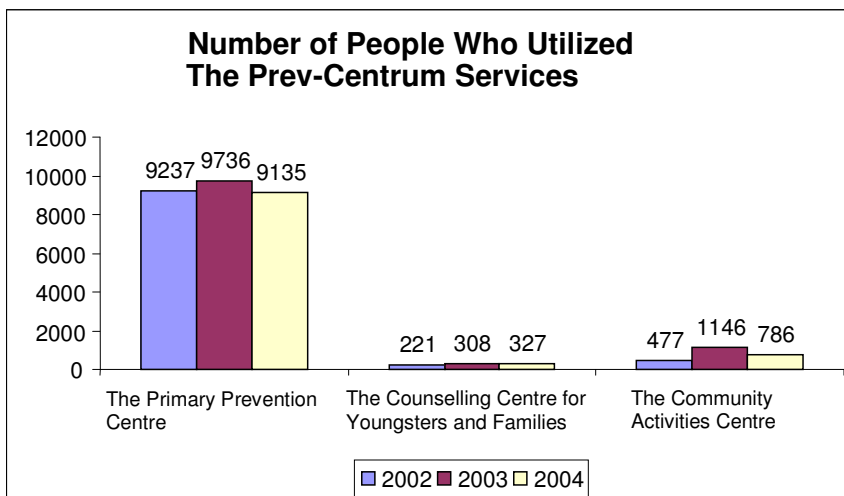
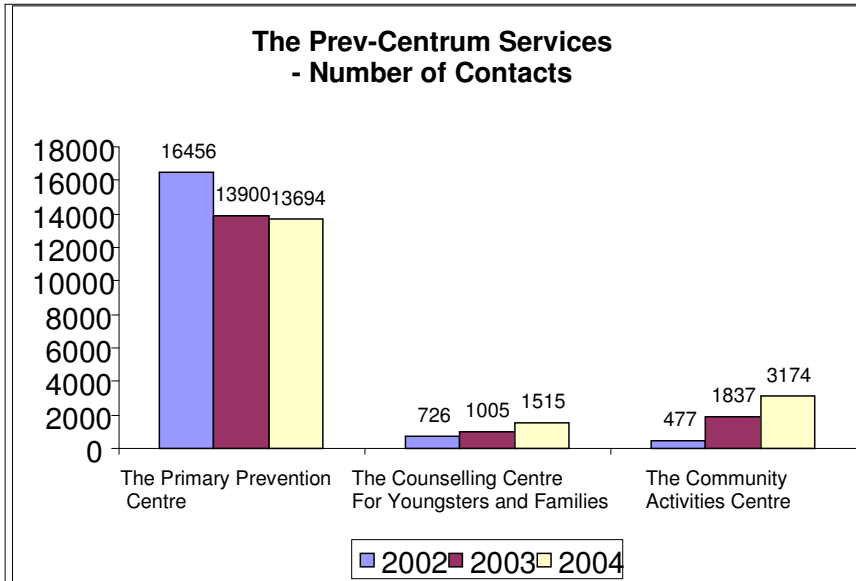

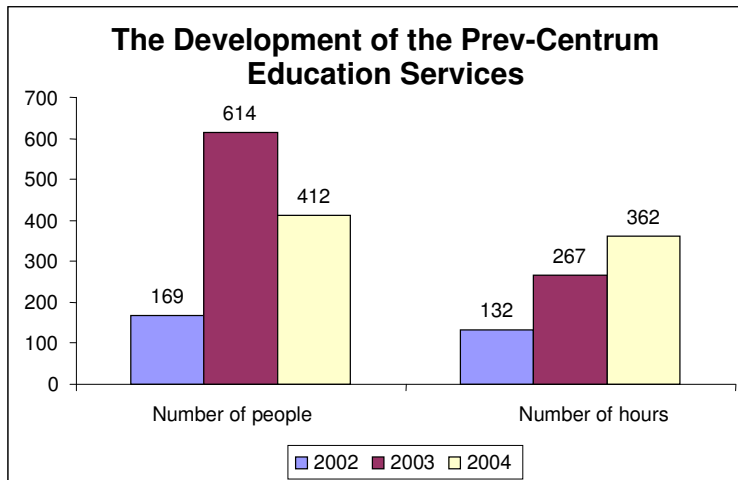

The Primary Prevention Centre

The services of the Primary Prevention Centre focus on the specific primary prevention of drug abuse and other social-pathological phenomena, helping schools and teachers to fight the problems that exceed the borderlines of the Minimum preventive programme framework. There are three levels on which the Primary Prevention Centre's Services are provided: general primary prevention, selective primary prevention and indicated primary prevention. The main difference between the three levels is the character of a target group with respect to the level of risk behaviour. The Centre's programmes include education of school methodologists, teachers and other professionals.

The Primary Prevention Centre provides a complex programme of primary prevention of drug abuse and other social-pathological phenomena with the goal of stipulation the links between the particular programmes. There are four programmes linked together: general primary prevention, selective primary prevention, indicated primary prevention and education.

1. Goals

- Prevention of social-pathological phenomena increase
- Healthy life-style
- Provision of information
- Strengthening one's own personal responsibility for his/her quality of life
- Reinforcing one's self-confidence
- Offering positive models and alternatives

2. Primary Target Group

- normal population of children and adolescents (10-15 year-old primary school students and secondary school students)
- risk groups of children and adolescents (students from specialised schools and problematic primary school classes)
- risk individuals (children with problematic position in a group, children with behavioural disorders, hyperactive children)

3. Secondary Target Group

- college and university students
- specialised school teachers, primary school teachers and secondary school teachers
- school methodologists of prevention
- parents
- social workers, general practitioners, psychologists

4. Provided Services

General Primary Prevention

- long-term programme of primary prevention of drug addiction and other social-pathological phenomena at primary schools (6th to 9th grade of primary schools)
- interactive seminars for secondary schools (1st and 2nd grades of secondary schools)

Long term programme of general primary prevention of drug addiction and other social-pathological phenomena is focused on influencing the attitude and behaviour of children during the time of their school attendance (6th to 9th grades).

A couple of trained lecturers accompanies the students on their way from the 6th grade to the 9th grade.

Each class has got two workshops per year – i.e. 6 hours of primary prevention programme a year.

The topics of the programme differ in particular classes in respect to the age of children: e.g. drugs, communication, healthy life-style, emotions, religious sects, AIDS and chicane.

Interactive seminars for secondary schools

The programme of general primary prevention of drug addiction and other social-pathological phenomena includes single interactive seminars designed for the 1st to 2nd grade secondary school students

A couple of trained lecturers, the Prev-Centrum employees, works with the class.

The interactive seminar takes 2 classes, i.e. 1.5 hour.

The topics of the programme include e.g. drugs, communication, healthy life-style, emotions, religious sects, AIDS and chicane.

Selective Primary Prevention

- the programme of specific primary prevention for risk groups of children and adolescents in the form of an intensive collective work in school classes

The programme is designed for risk groups of children and adolescents – school classes.

The programme helps the group of children in a class to develop, it assists children to find effective solutions of problems.

The programme consists of 3 to 5 workshops in a relatively short period of time, with the co-operation of teachers.

Indicated Primary Prevention

- a club for 10 to 15-year old kids, who have behavioural problems or a problematic position in their class.
- Individual consultations for kids, teachers, parents

The programme is focused on the development of communicative skills, empathy, strengthening one's self-confidence, self-esteem, training of social skills, enhancing the ability to resist the pressure from risky classmates, gaining the positive approach to oneself etc.

- The club is designed for kids with behavioural problems or a problematic position in their class; the group meets regularly once a week for two hours.

Club activities include one-day or three-day outdoor trips and individual consultations for children and teachers.

Education

- a) Courses and seminars for school prevention methodologist and teachers

The Research Project of Evaluation of Community Primary Prevention Programme in Prague 6

The longitudinal research (2002 – 2007) has been carried out in co-operation with the Czech Academy of Science. It focuses on Prague 6 population. The evaluation of effects (consequences) of the community primary prevention project is based on the comparison of three risk indicators development in a sample of

Prague-6 primary school students. The control group (sample) comes from those Prague-6 schools that do not participate in the community programme (practicing only the so-called Minimum prevention programme) and from primary schools near the Prague-6 border bearing the same characteristics as the rest of the control group.

The Structure of the Research Project

1st phase: 1st testing of the sample in classes on 5th grades – a test (2003)

2nd phase: focus groups in classes on 6th grades, structured interviews with school prevention methodologists (2004)

3rd phase: 2nd testing of the sample in classes on 7th grades – inter-test (2005)

4th phase: focus groups in classes on 6th grades (2006)

5th phase: 3rd testing of the sample in classes on 9th grades – retest (2007)

The team of professionals *co-ordinates, organises and provides the general primary prevention* of drug addiction and other social-pathological phenomena at primary schools. Moreover, members of the team *lead selective primary prevention* programmes and an *indicated primary prevention* programme. The team

activities include all administration and professional background for the lecturers of general primary prevention at primary schools. The staff members also lead selective prevention workshops that involve work with problematic school classes, consultations with teachers, parents and kids, and provide indicated primary prevention programme – a club for kids with a problematic position in a class. Moreover, the centre has got 65 external collaborators - primary prevention lecturers.

7. Co-operation with Other Institutions within the Social Network

The system of services provided by the Primary Prevention Centre is linked with the services of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families so that in indicated cases it is possible to forward children with their parents there.

In the field of primary prevention, it is essential to co-operate with school prevention methodologists and school counsellors at schools participating in the general primary prevention programme (especially schools in the districts of Prague 6 and Prague 2). This co-operation includes meetings of the Primary Prevention Centre staff with school prevention methodologists. We also co-operate with representatives of the local government and of the state administration (the Prague-6 Municipal Office, the Municipality of Prague), and with other organisations (Counselling Office for School Children Prague 6, OPD office of Prague 1 and 6, Youth Centre Klíčov, Trigon etc.). The co-operation with other institutions makes it possible to provide the complex system of services that involve the first contact at schools, the possibility of gaining more information in the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families, participating in the youth club's activities, or possibly counselling/therapy in the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families. The Primary Prevention Centre finds it very important to co-operate also with other institutions within the network of drug addiction treatment services. Professionals from these institutions come to lecture for primary prevention lecturers or lead seminars for the public organised by the Prev-Centrum, NGO.

8. Conclusions and Suggestions

Key points

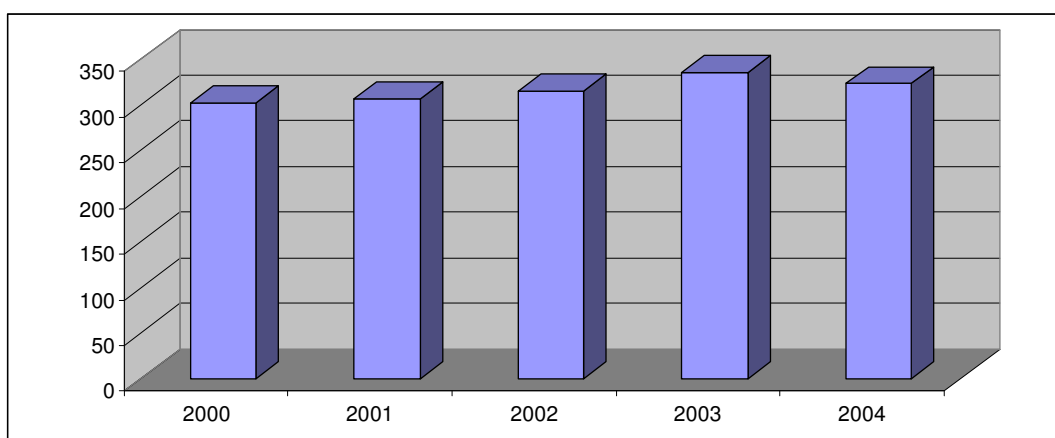

The Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families

The Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families, the Prev-Centrum, NGO, is an out-patient therapeutic institution providing counselling, therapy and social services for children, adolescents, young people and their families, i.e. for people endangered by consequences of non-alcoholic drug abuse or people who find themselves in other risky or troublesome situations. The programme of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families is a part of the community prevention system offered by the Prev-Centrum, NGO. In 2004, the out-patient services of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families focused on following issues: the first contact and anonymous counselling; work with families of drug users; individual and group therapy of drug users including the substitution programme (Buprenorfine).

1. Target Group

Addictive substance users

- Children and youngsters using non-alcoholic drugs occasionally
- Children and youngsters experimenting with addictive substances
- Adolescents and young people abusing addictive substances
- Non-alcoholic drug addicts
- Members of the Buprenorfine (Subutex®) substitution programme
- People abstaining after out-patient or in-patient therapy (including unfinished therapy)
- Families, parents, other family members and other close people to a drug user
- Families with problems connected with risk behaviour of a child (truancy, thefts etc.)

2. Programme Objectives

The general objective of the out-patient services of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families is focusing the attention on a wide range of clients offering services that comply with the standards of professional competence.

Specific goals

- Motivating the client (drug user) to change his/her behaviour or life-style so that they are able to abstain from drugs in future
- Reduction of health and social risks connected with the client's risk behaviour
- Reduction of a relapse risk in cases of abstaining clients using the methods of relapse prevention; supporting long-term abstinence
- Provision of professional help to drug users and their families with the aim of social and health risks reduction
- Support of drug users and their families in their effort to make positive changes in their individual lives and changes in the family system
- Strengthening the self-recovering potential of an individual and of the family system
- Provision of counselling and support for parents and relatives of drug users in the time of crisis
- Provision of an intensive psycho-social care for the clients in the Buprenorfine substitution programme, helping to stabilize them and possibly assisting them to abstain

The service includes a regularly up-dated social network database. On-line counselling is in compliance with the International Society for Mental Health Online standards.

4. Development of the Programme in 2004

In 2004, the services of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families were divided into two basic groups: out-patient services for drug users and out-patient counselling and therapeutic services for families, relatives and other close people to drug users.

One of the most important changes in the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families activities was starting up the out-patient treatment combined with the **Buprenorfine (Subutex®) substitution programme** – i.e. the psychosocial component of the substitution programme. The development of this concept was caused by changes on the drug scene in Prague and the region of Central Bohemia – the increase of Subutex users (both legal and illegal). The Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families tried to reflect the trends by extending the range of the services and altering the structure of services for this target group. The Centre initiated co-operation with healthcare institutions that offer the Buprenorfine (Subutex®) substitution programme. The Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families provides the psychosocial component of the programme - i.e. support and help leading to stabilisation of a client (motivation towards changes of behaviour and life-style, improving social skills, finding new solutions of daily problems, minimising health and social risks, assistance in personal development and progress).

Out-patient counselling and therapeutic **services for families, relatives and other close people** to the identified clients were in 2004 the main focus of the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families programme. Comparing to the year 2003, in 2004 there was increase of the demand for this type of service. There were 7% more sessions of family counselling/therapy than in the previous year. This positive development was also caused by changes in the staff.

During the year 2004, the Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families staff co-operated with other institutions on creating and improvement of the FreeBase database (controlled by the National Monitoring Centre of the Council for Coordination of Drug Control Policy of the Government Office of the Czech Republic – sRVKPP). The practical outcome of the FreeBase project are the statistics data of the programme.

The Counselling Centre for Youngsters and Families programme includes education for professional public with the aim of supporting interdisciplinary approach and development. In May 2004, the offer was broadened starting up the Course of Family Counselling (122 hours) that is going to be finished in June 2005. The course is designed for professionals specialised in drug addiction and treatment and is guaranteed by MUDr. V. Chvála and the Society of Family Therapy (SOFT). The course received the SOFT certificate of short programmes.

Community Activities Centre

The Community Activities Centre is the youngest of the Prev-Centrum programmes. It started to work in January 2002. It is based on the principles of civic society – strengthening competence of community members, feeling the responsibility not only for one's own life or health but also for other people in the neighbourhood and for the community district.

The programme's activities focus on non-specific community prevention – i.e. running specific programmes for selected groups of community inhabitants, especially risky children or adolescents. This particular group of population have the chance to visit a low-threshold youth club in the Community Activities Centre. Other activities include support to other Prague-6 institutions that want to offer their services to the inhabitants – i.e. mapping and networking of local service providers, database of leisure-time activities at: www.kmen.info, social network information service and support of activities focused on healthy life-style.

1. Target Group

Primary (end) target group – group of people, which is to be prevented from risky behaviour – mostly persons at formative age, i.e. children and young people. The Community Activities Centre offers the low-threshold youth club to the primary target group, which involves children and adolescents at the age of twelve to twenty – the potentially risky individuals.

Secondary (intermediary) target group – group of people that have a direct influence on the primary target group (e.g. parents, teachers, instructors, policemen or other adults in local community that are in regular contact with the children). These people come to the Centre to ask for information or advice, often they are not familiar with the offer of psycho-social services in their neighbourhood.

2. Programme Objectives

General aim of the programme is implementing non-specific community prevention in the community of Prague 6 – i.e. by means of community work reinforcing activities focused on healthy life-style.

Moreover, the Community Activities Centre's aim is complementing the non-specific prevention by specific prevention and thus offering the complex service of community prevention in Prague 6.

- Searching disadvantaged or endangered individuals and groups of children and youngsters in their natural environment
- Reducing immediate social risks connected with their life-style
- Integrating children and youngsters into groups of their equals and society; engaging them in the community life
- Support in solving life difficulties and helping to accept consequences of risk behaviour
- Improving Prague-6 inhabitants awareness of the psycho-social service network in their district
- Developing and extending the services in the Prague-6 district with the aim of creating a complex network of services
- Reinforcing the feeling of solidarity with the community; strengthening the whole Prague-6 community
- Supporting team co-operation of all participating organisations

Low-threshold Youth Club “Basement” provides activating and educative services, social-pedagogical and social work

4. Development of the Programme in 2004

Low-Threshold Youth Club started to work in October 2002.

In 2004, the Community Activities Centre focused on provision of specific services to the primary target group – risky children and adolescents. The youth club became the principal part of the Centre's activities. In 2004, the low-threshold youth club's opening hours extended and the club was open four days a week. Since February 2004, we started to record the number of clients and types of interventions in the youth club more precisely. The system of documentation helps us to monitor better our activities so that we can improve our services according to the clients' feed-back.

Websites www.kmen.info

In 2004, the websites were changed considerably. The new database of social services in Prague 6 was created and started to work on-line. Moreover, the websites were re-organised into a new version, which is simpler and better-organised. On 16th of November 2004, the web-sites www.kmen.info started to work in new design.

Mapping of Social Services and Information Service

In 2003, information was provided personally, on telephone or by e-mail. Since 2004, we decided to focus on other types of services and the information service was run only through internet. Although the personal and telephone information service was continued the focus was on the utilisation of the social service database at www.kmen.info that started to work in April 2004. During the database preparation all the data was updated.

Cultural Events

The Prev-Centrum, NGO offers rooms for exhibitions to organisations, individuals or groups from the district of Prague 6. During 2004, we organised six exhibitions.

The Community Activities Centre co-operates with the community programme Healthy Prague 6. We helped to organise the project “The Week of Healthy Prague 6”. As a part of this project we organised a two-day expert seminar focused on primary and secondary prevention in Prague 6. Another programme belonging to the Healthy Prague 6 project was the Goblin programme for kids.

There was one more supplementary activity of the Community Activities Centre in the project of non-specific prevention in 2004 – a film club. Films are projected every last Wednesday in a month in co-operation with the Hollywood Classic Entertainment that provides projection rights to particular films. This service is designed especially for Prague-6 inhabitants and it is free of charge.

6. Co-operation with Other Institutions within the Psycho-Social Network

Effectiveness of the Community Activities Centre services depends on good co-operation with organisations in Prague 6, especially the Prague-6 Municipal office (community programme Healthy Prague 6), primary and secondary schools and institutions offering social services to children and adolescents. With respect to this fact we found extremely important the Forum of Psycho-Social Service Providers focused on primary and secondary prevention in Prague 6. The programme was supported by the Prague-6 Municipal Office and it was a two-day meeting of experts from schools and other institutions specialising in social service for Prague-6 children and adolescents.

The Community Activities Centre also helps with the Goblin programme for kids, under the auspices of the Prague-6 Municipal Office. There are seven Prague-6 organisations (including the Prev-Centrum) that participate in the programme, each of them preparing one phase of the game. We also took part in the Full Jug project – the fair of social services in Prague 6.
